Charge(s): Sexual Boundary Breach
Outcome Date: October 9, 2018

The allegations in the charge have not been admitted, nor has there been a hearing before the discipline committee to determine whether the allegations in the charge will be proved.

The matter was resolved when Dr. Ukabam agreed to relinquish his licence and never to practice medicine anywhere in the world in the future.

The Council of the College of Physicians and Surgeons directs that, pursuant to section 47.5 and/or 47.6 of **The Medical Profession Act, 1981**, the Discipline Committee hear the following charge against Dr. Sylvester Ukabam, namely:

You Dr. Sylvester Ukabam are guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional, or discreditable conduct contrary to the provisions of Section 46(o) and/or section 46(p) of **The Medical Profession Act, 1981** S.S. 1980-81 c. M-10.1 and/or bylaw 8.1(b)(ix) and/or bylaw 8.1(b)(xvi) of the bylaws of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan.

The evidence that will be led in support of this charge will include the following:

- a) A female person hereinafter referred to in this charge as Patient 2 was your patient at all times material to this charge;
- b) On or about the 23rd day of June, 2014 Patient 2 attended upon you for medical care;
- c) Patient 2 was directed to disrobe and don a gown;
- d) Patient 2 was positioned on an examination table in an "all fours" position with her buttocks in the air;
- e) During the examination you moved your finger or fingers around Patient 2's genital area;
- f) During the examination you inserted a finger or fingers into Patient 2's vagina;
- g) You did not have Patient 2's consent to examine her genital area;

- h) You did not have Patient 2's consent to examine her vagina;
- i) You did not have Patient 2's consent to insert a finger or fingers into her vagina;
- j) There was no medical indication for you to move your finger or fingers around Patient 2's genital area;
- k) There was no medical indication for you to examine Patient 2's vagina.
- There was no medical indication for you to insert a finger or fingers into the Patient 2's vagina.
- m) Following the examination, you watched Patient 2 as she was dressing;
- n) Following the examination, you gave Patient 2 a hug.
