The Council of the College of Physicians and Surgeons directs that, pursuant to section 47.6 of **The Medical Profession Act, 1981**, the Discipline Committee hear the following charges against Dr. Assem Sultan El-Sayed, namely:

- You Dr. Assem Sultan El-Sayed are guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional, or discreditable conduct contrary to the provisions of Section 46(o) of **The Medical Profession Act, 1981** s.s. 1980-81 c. M-10.1.
  The evidence that will be lead in support of this charge will include one or more of the following:
  - a) You applied for licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan and supplied a document purporting to indicate that you had been awarded a M.Sc. From Cairo University as part of that application;
  - b) You altered the document which you provided to the College of Physicians and Surgeons;
  - c) The original, unaltered, document from Cairo University did not state that you had been awarded a M.Sc. degree;
  - d) You did not have a M.Sc. degree from Cairo University;
- 2. You Dr. Assem Sultan El-Sayed are guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional, or discreditable conduct contrary to the provisions of Section 46(o) of **The Medical Profession Act, 1981** s.s. 1980-81 c. M-10.1. The evidence that will be lead in support of this charge will include one or more of the following:
  - a) On or about July 12, 2011 you received a letter from the College of Physicians and Surgeons inquiring into the authenticity of the document which purported to indicate that you had been awarded a M.Sc. degree from Cairo University;
  - b) On or about July 12, you responded to the College of Physicians and Surgeons, stating:

[T]here appears to be some concerns regarding some corrections in the document presented but if you review the document you would find that the corrections were marked and stamped with the university seal for every correction performed, which is the standard practice in my country for correcting mistakes as these documents are usually made using a type writer (manually).

Nevertheless, if you require another document I believe I can send for another one to be obtained within 2 weeks by the most.

And further more I believe I presented these documents to be verified from the source (my university), and if that is the case, I believe a verification from my university directly would clear this matter, please advise me on how to procede next.

c) Statements in your email message of July 12, 2011 to the College of Physicians and Surgeons were not true.
