


CPD credits and the NAC examination

A physician can expect to earn a total **9.5 hours** of work as a physician examiner at the National Assessment Collaboration (NAC) examination per exam day worked (8.5 hours for exam day plus 1 hour of online orientation participation). Spare examiners earn 2 hours based upon the online training session time and physician examiner on-site time. Chief examiners earn **9.5 hours** for every exam day worked.

Physician examiners' work typically includes but is not limited to:

- Providing accurate and standardized judgments while scoring candidates' performances on examination day;
- Troubleshooting any unclear points regarding the clinical content with the site's Chief Examiner(s);
- Participating in the on-line physician examiner training and receiving feedback for this scoring exercise;
- Providing feedback on the OSCE station content.
